Fribourg is home to Switzerland's only bilingual university. Nearly all subjects offer students the opportunity to pursue their studies in French, German or both languages. Those who complete their studies by attending at least 40% of the courses in a second language will receive a degree with the mention "Bilingual Studies". Furthermore, international study programs are offered in English.
